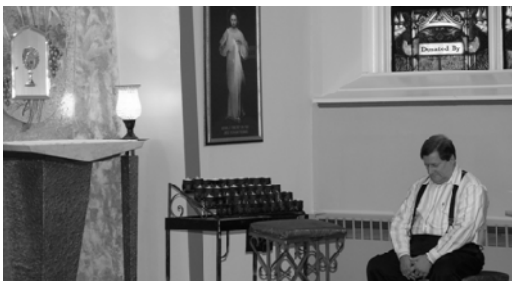


# **Fatima Mirror**

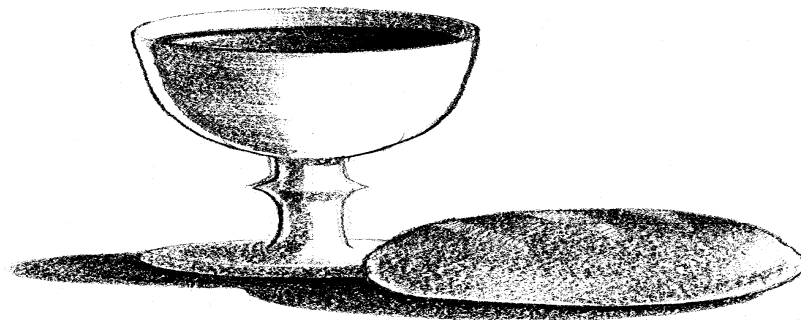

# **YEAR OF THE PRIEST**

## **CELEBRATED IN THE DIOCESE OF ALTOONA-JOHNSTOWN**

### **Schedule of Events**

(1) Each Parish within the Diocese is invited to have Holy Hour with Eucharistic Adoration. The particular time will be determined by each faith community during the Advent-Christmas Season, Winter Ordinary Time, Lent, or Easter Season. Following repossession, there will be the option of veneration of first class relic of Saint John Vianney. The relic is available at these four parishes: Saint John Vianney Parish, Mundy's Corner: 814-322-4789, Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament, Altoona: 814-944-4603, Our Lady of Victory Parish, State College: 814-237-7832, Saint Aloysius Parish, Cresson: 814-886-2235

(2) Bishop will gather with his priests on Monday, February 15th (Presidents Day; close to Mardi Gras) at 6 P.M. at Saint John Vianney Church, Mundy's Corner. Evening Prayer will be followed by a social and dinner.

(3) Two lectures on the priesthood will be scheduled in Lent. This event will take place in Loretto. The first session will be from 2:00 P.M. - 4:00 P.M. (especially for priests; faithful invited); the second session will be from 7:00 P.M. — 8:00 P.M. (directed to faithful; clergy welcome). After the first session, hospitality will be offered to the priests at Saint Michael Hall with a social and dinner.

(4) There will be Mass on Tuesday, June 29 (Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul) at 7:00 P.M. in the Altoona Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament celebrating the Year of the Priest. The invitation is open to all in the Diocese. Bishop Joseph will be celebrating his fiftieth anniversary of ordination to the priesthood. Also, the Bishop will be reaching his 75th birthday having served the Local Church as Chief Shepherd for twenty-three years.

(5) Plan a summer pilgrimage on a one day bus trip. Priests with bishop will visit the newly restored chapel of Saint Mary's Seminary in Baltimore, the first seminary in the United States. Also, visit the newly restored Basilica of the Assumption, the first Catholic cathedral in this country. Mass will be celebrated. All will dine at a local restaurant and return home.

**Each parishioner of Our Lady of Fatima Parish is asked to make a private weekly Eucharistic Holy Hour with the primary intention being Priests in general and in particular, the living and deceased priests of Altoona-Johnstown.**
